AN ORDINANCE **78782**

AMENDING ORDINANCE NOS. 74024 AND 76456;
AND APPOINTING MEMBERS TO SERVE ON THE
SAN ANTONIO YOUTH COMMISSION.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 74024, passed and approved on July 25, 1991, established the San Antonio Youth Commission; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 76456, passed and approved on September 10, 1992, appointed members and alternates to serve on the Commission in accordance with Ordinance No. 74024; and

WHEREAS, said Commission was created to facilitate an open line of communication between San Antonio youth and City policy makers in order to formulate solutions to problems affecting local youth; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with §2 of Ordinance No. 74024, two members will be appointed from each of the ten City Council Districts, as well as two at-large members appointed by the Mayor; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. §2 of Ordinance No. 74024, passed and approved on July 25, 1991, as amended by §3 of Ordinance No. 76456, passed and approved on September 10, 1992, is hereby repealed and the following language is substituted:

The Youth Commission will act as an advisory committee to the Mayor and City Council. Said Commission shall consist of twenty-two members, all of which shall be voting members. Two members shall be chosen from each City Council District by the City Council and two members shall be chosen at-large by the Mayor. The Office of Youth Initiatives is charged with keeping the Commission focused on a predetermined agenda during monthly meetings and assisting in reporting back to the City Council. The Commission will be staffed by a secretary from the Office of Youth Initiatives.



CREATING A YOUTH COMMISSION FOR THE CITY OF
SAN ANTONIO.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, the youth of San Antonio are a valuable segment of the community whose ideas and perspectives provide unique insight into city issues and problems; and

WHEREAS, many decisions and policies of the City of San Antonio City Council directly affect local youth; and

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to provide the youth of San Antonio with an opportunity and a vehicle to respond to current situations that affect young persons ; NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. A Youth Commission is hereby created for the City of San Antonio. The goals and objectives of the commission will be to respond to current situations affecting young persons, and to develop solutions for problems to be presented by the Mayor and City Council Members. The Youth Commission will further work toward unifying the youth of San Antonio into a positive force for the good of the community.

SECTION 2. Said Commission will act as an advisory committee to the Mayor and City Council. It shall consist of twenty-two student members. Two members are to be chosen from each council district, one voting member and one alternate. Two at-large student members will be chosen by the Mayor, one voting member and one alternate. A sponsor from the Department of Community Initiatives will be charged with keeping the Commission focused on a predetermined agenda during monthly meetings and assisting in reporting back to the City Council. The Commission will be staffed by a secretary from the Department of Community Initiatives
