AN ORDINANCE **7 537 1**

AMENDING THE NAME OF THE HANDICAPPED ACCESS
ADVISORY COMMITTEE BY REPLACING THE WORD
"HANDICAPPED" WITH THE WORD "DISABILITY";
AMENDING ITS FUNCTIONS; AND REAFFIRMING THE
CONTINUATION OF PERSONS AS MEMBERS OF THE
COMMITTEE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. Since the Americans with Disability Act took effect on January 26, 1992, the term "handicapped" has been replaced by the more accurate and appropriate term "disabled". It is therefore appropriate that the City's Handicapped Access Advisory Committee and the Handicapped Access Office reinforce the Americans with Disabilities Act through an official name change:

DISABILITY ACCESS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

DISABILITY ACCESS OFFICE

SECTION 2. The Committee will continue to be composed of eleven members, the majority of whom shall be representatives of cross disability. The content or compliment shall remain as originally designated. The terms of office shall be updated to two years staggered terms as adopted by the City Council's Resolution #87-30-48 dated June 18, 1987. Any vacancies occurring during a term of office will be filled as soon as possible by the City Council. The Committee will make available to the City Council a current list of names of persons who qualify and are willing to serve as members of the Disability Access Committee.

SECTION 3. The Committee's stated functions shall remain the same as originally adopted in April 25, 1979:

1. To sensitize City departments to the access problems of the disabled.
2. To advise in the development of a comprehensive library of disabled access planning information which is capable of being updated.
3. To review surveys of city buildings for access problems and monitor scheduling of the corrections of those problems.
4. To assist in the forming of recommendations of city design requirements for disabled access compliance.

5. To review all City Codes and recommend amendments when applicable to assure disabled access compliance.
6. To assist in the establishment of accessibility to employment for disabled people within the City structure.
7. To develop recommendations on the future role of the Disability Access Office.
8. To serve as ombudsman between City Departments, private business sector, sector, and the community of disabled citizens.
9. To periodically review the purpose and make-up of the Disability Access Advisory Committee.
10. To achieve the goals of the Americans with Disabilities Act as passed by the U. S. Congress and signed into law by the President.



AMENDING THE NAME OF THE HANDICAPPED ACCESS ADVISORY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION I: That with the Americans with Disability Act officially recognized as law and in force as January 26, 1992, the term "handicapped" has been replaced by more accurate and appropriate term "disabled". It is therefore, appropriate that the City's Handicapped Access Advisory Committee and the Handicapped Access Office reinforce the Americans with Disabilities Act through its official name change:

DISABILITY ACCESS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

DISABILITY ACCESS OFFICE

SECTION II: The Committee will continue to be composed of eleven members, the majority of whom shall be representatives of cross disability. The content or compliment shall remain as originally designated. The terms of office shall be updated to two years staggered terms as adopted by the City Council's Resolution #87-30-48 dated June 18, 1987. SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION: This ordinance authorizes the amendment to Ordinance No. 50680 which established a Handicapped Access Advisory Committee, designated the functions of the Committee, and appointed persons as members of the Committee.

With the Americans with Disability Act officially recognized as law and in effect as of January 26, 1992, the term "handicapped" has been replaced by more accurate and appropriate term "disabled". It is therefore, appropriate that the City's Handicapped Access Advisory Committee and the Handicapped Access Office reinforce the Americans with Disability Act through its official name change:

The committee will continue with its designated members -the majority of whom are representatives of cross-disabilities. The content or compliment shall remain the same as originally adopted. We recommend approval of this ordinance.



Fiscal Impact: The Americans with Disabilities Act effective January 26, 1992 encompasses federal laws requiring compliance re: non-discriminatory action towards disabled people in the areas of employment, public services, public accommodations, transportation, housing and telecommunications, respectively.

Conclusion: The Disability Access Office will continue to monitor process of implementation of policies and procedures for city compliance with the Americans with Disability Act of 1990. Along with these challenges, the Disability Access Office will alert all city departments and organizations of its name change.

<p>The City of San Antonio in 1977 created the Handicapped Access Office to provide technical assistance and support to implement Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973; and now endorses the letter and spirit of the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) passed by the U. S. Congress and signed into law by the President. The Americans with Disabilities Act recognizes the isolation, and discrimination, and segregation of persons with disabilities.</p> <p>The Planning Department, Disability Access Office requests amendment to Ordinance No. 50680 which established a Handicapped Access Advisory Committee, designated the functions of the Committee, and appointed persons as members of the Committee. The amendment to this ordinance will address the official name change of the DISABILITY ACCESS ADVISORY COMMITTEE and the DISABILITY ACCESS OFFICE and will also update the committee's term of office to two years staggered terms as adopted by City Council Resolution #87-30-48 dated June 28, 1987.</p> <p>Staff has reviewed this ordinance and recommends approval.</p>




