Councilman Wutton introduced an ordinance

and made a motion that it be passed. The motion was seconded by Councilman The ordinance was read in full by the City Clerk.

The motion carrying with it the passage of the ordinance prevailed by the following vote:

The Mayor announced that the ordinance had been passed. The ordinance as passed is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE

CANVASSING RETURNS AND DECLARING RESULTS OF AN ELECTION ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,629,000.00 STREET CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVE-MENT BONDS; ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,350,000.00 SANITARY SEWER IMPROVEMENT AND EXTENSION BONDS; ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$12,000,000.00 STORM SEWER AND DRAINAGE BONDS; ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,876,000.00 FOR A NEW POLICE HEADQUARTERS BUILDING BONDS; ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$877,000.00 PARKS AND RECREATION IMPROVEMENT AND EXTENSION BONDS; ON THE PROPOSITION OF THE ISSUANCE OF \$2,000,000.00 U. S. HIGHWAY 181, SOUTH, EXPRESSWAY RIGHT-OF-WAY BONDS.

WHEREAS, heretofore on the 3rd day of October, 1957, the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, passed an ordinance calling an election to be held in said City on the 22nd day of October, 1957, on the following propositions:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$4,629,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of building, grading, paving, curbing and improving the streets of said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$3,350,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of improving and extending the Sanitary Sewer System of said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$12,000,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and improving storm sewers, and the storm drainage appurtenances and accessories thereto of said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 4

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,876,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 5

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$877,000.00 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of acquiring property for and extending, improving and constructing Parks and Recreational facilities in said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 6

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,000,000.00, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity, for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring right-of-way and necessary approaches for U. S. Highway No. 181, South, Expressway to be constructed within the area of the City bounded on the North by East Commerce Street, on the East and South by the City limits and on the West by the San Antonio River."

(If the above described bonds are approved, then the City Council will not be authorized to issue the \$2,000,000.00 of bonds voted for the same purpose at the election held July 10, 1954, and said authorization shall be considered to have been revoked and cancelled.)

WHEREAS, said election was duly held at the time and places specified after due notice as required by law had been given by posting and publication; and

WHEREAS, said election was duly and legally held on the 22nd day of October, 1957, in conformity with the election ordinance heretofore passed by the City Council and the result of said election has been

certified and returned to this Council by the proper judges and clerks thereof; and

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS:

1. That said election was duly called; that notice was given in accordance with law and in accordance with the ordinance calling the election; that the election was held in accordance with law; that the return of said election has been made by the proper officers.

2. That Proposition No. 1 for the issuance of \$4,629,000.00 of Street Construction and Improvement Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with Proposition No. 1;

\$3,350,000.00 Sanitary Sewer Improvement and Extension Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with Proposition No. 2;

\$12,000,000.00 of Storm Sewer and Drainage Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with Proposition No. 3;

That Proposition No. 6 for the issuance of \$2,000,000.00 of U. S. Highway No. 181, South, Expressway Right-of-Way Bonds was sustained and approved by a majority of

the resident, qualified electors who own taxable property in said city and who have duly rendered same for taxation voting in said city and who have duly rendered same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, is hereby authorized to issue said bonds in accordance with Proposition No. 6;

That Proposition No. 4 for the issuance of \$2,876,000.00 of New Police Headquarters Building Bonds, and Proposition No. 5 for the issuance of \$877,000.00 of Parks and Recreation Improvement and Extension Bonds, were not approved by a majority of the resident, qualified voters who own taxable property in said city who duly rendered the same for taxation voting in said election, and the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, pursuant to the voters' disapproval of Propositions Nos. 4 and 5 hereby declare said propositions disapproved.

- 2. That the City Council be and it is hereby in all things authorized, ordered and directed to issue said bonds and to do any and all things necessary or convenient in connection therewith.
- 3. An emergency exists for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, welfare, and safety, requiring that this ordinance become effective immediately, therefore, upon passage, this ordinance by an affirmative vote of six (6) members of the City Council, shall be effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by the Charter of the City of San Antonio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:-

1. That an election be held in the said City of San Antonio, Texas, on the 22nd day of October, 1957, at which election the following propositions shall be submitted to the resident, qualified electors of the City of San Antonio, Texas, who own taxable property in said City and who have duly rendered the same for taxation:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$4,629,000 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of building, grading, paving, curbing and improving the streets of said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$3,350,000 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of improving and extending the Sanitary Sewer System of said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of said City."

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$12,000,000 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and improving storm sewers, and the storm drainage appurtenances and accessories thereto of said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 4

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,876,000 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, for the purpose of constructing and permanently equipping a new Police Headquarters Building in said City, as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 5

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$877,000 maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity for the purpose of acquiring property for and extending, improving and constructing Parks and Recreational facilities in said City as authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, and the Charter of the City of San Antonio."

PROPOSITION NO. 6

"Shall the City Council of the City of San Antonio, Texas, be authorized to issue the bonds of said City in the amount of \$2,000,000, maturing serially in such installments as the City Council may prescribe, the maximum maturity being not more than 30 years from their date, bearing interest at a rate not to exceed 5% per annum, and to levy a tax on all taxable property within said City sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity, for the purpose of purchasing and acquiring right-of-way and necessary approaches for U. S. Highway No. 181, South, Expressway to be constructed within the area of the City bounded on the North by East Commerce Street, on the East and South by the City limits and on the West by the San Antonio River."

(If the above described bonds are approved, then the City Council will not be authorized to issue the \$2,000,000 of bonds voted for the same purpose at the election held July 10, 1954, and said authorization shall be considered to have been revoked and cancelled.)

2. That voting machines shall be employed at the election herein ordered in accordance with the provisions of V.A.T.S. Election Code, Article 7.14, and voting machines shall be used for the casting of absentee votes in the office of the City Clerk, which absentee balloting shall be conducted in the manner made and provided by the Statutes of the State of Texas on the subject, and said election shall be held at the polling places in the regularly prescribed voting precincts of the City of San Antonio, between the hours of 7:00 o'clock A.M. and 7:00 P.M.
