

AN ORDINANCE 2011-08-18-0670

AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A TEXAS INTRASTATE FIRE MUTUAL AID SYSTEM (TIFMAS) GRANT APPLICATION AND, UPON AWARD, THE ACCEPTANCE AND APPROPRIATION OF GRANT FUNDS NOT TO EXCEED \$8,400.00 FOR THIRTY-FOUR (34) SETS OF LIGHTWEIGHT PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE).

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WHEREAS, the Texas Intrastate Fire Mutual Aid System (TIFMAS) Grant Assistance Program has available funds in an amount of up to \$8,400.00 to be used toward the purchase of thirty-four sets of lightweight personal protective equipment (PPE); and

WHEREAS, the cost of said equipment is approximately \$9,333.00; and

WHEREAS, a cash matching contribution of \$933.00 is required; and

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Fire Department (SAFD) wishes to submit a grant application for said funds to purchase said equipment in support of the SAFD Wildland Team; **NOW THEREFORE:**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SAN ANTONIO:

SECTION 1. The City Manager and her designee are hereby authorized to submit a grant application to the TIFMAS Grant Assistance Program for funds in an amount of up to \$8,400.00 to be used toward the purchase of thirty-four sets of lightweight PPE in support of the SAFD Wildland Team. The City Manager and her designee are hereby authorized to accept said grant, if awarded under substantially the same terms and conditions as applied for. The City Manager and her designee are further authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to effectuate said application and acceptance.


SECTION 2. Fund 26007000 (Texas Forest Service) is hereby designated for use in the accounting for the fiscal transaction in the acceptance of this grant. The sum of \$8,400.00 from the TIFMAS Grant Assistance Program will be appropriated in said fund.

SECTION 3. The financial allocations in this ordinance are subject to approval by the Chief Financial Officer (CFO), City of San Antonio. The CFO may, subject to concurrence by the City

Manager or the City Manager's designee, correct allocations to specific cost centers, WBS elements, internal orders, general ledger accounts, and fund numbers, as necessary to carry out the purpose of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage, provided that it is passed by eight or more affirmative votes; otherwise, this ordinance shall take effect ten days from the date of passage.



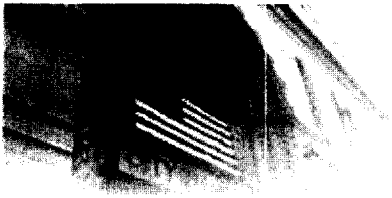

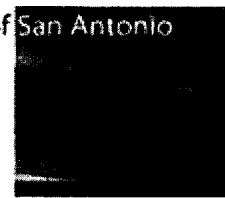
